This article on Billiards may be of interest to some especially that we learn about many champions come from our Filipino race.

In 2023, the Philippines created World Cup of Pool history by claiming a record fourth title beating Germany in Spain. The Filipino players are Johann Chua and James Aranas. The World Cup of Pool is an International single-elimination tournament for doubles team in a nine-ball competition where about 35 countries around the world send their best players and was being held once a year in different countries. Cash prizes and trophies are awarded to the winners.

In 2006, the first title was won by Filipino champions Efren "Bata" Reyes and Francisco "Busti" Bustamante and the second title was won in 2009 in Manila again by Reyes and Bustamante. In 2013, Dennis Orcollo and Lee Van Corteza won the third title in London.

Efren "Bata" Reyes was the first Filipino to win the US Open in 9 balls and 8 balls. For more than 15 years, Reyes was unbeatable in One Pocket billiards in the US. Efren is a member of the US Hall of Fame. In 2022, Carlo Biado was the second Filipino to win the US Open Title. What a great achievements by the Pinoys. Although Amang Parica did not win the US Open, he came close as runner-up. He was the first Pinoy player to invade the US billiards and that was the time when the Americans recognized the Pinoys as players to watch especially when Efren "Bata" Reyes came after him. I salute Mr. Puyat for promoting, financing and sending the Pinoy players not only in the US but also in different countries where there are tournaments.

Recently, in August another pinoy Anton Raga was runner-up in the European Championship bowing only to David Alcaide of Spain. What was amazing was that he is young and unknown in the world championship level but he beat a score of former world champions and the veterans in the elimination.

The Philippines is a powder keg of brilliant pool players in Asia having dominated the championships for many years up to this time. No wonder, in every barrios and towns in the Philippines, there are pool tables and aficionados.

Brethren, let us play on our pool tables. Let us be proud of our kababayans who are showing their prowess in the world.
